Quilt Exhibitor Information



REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS:

- Members and non-members of Eastern Long Island Quilter's Guild, Inc. (ELIQG), are invited to enter quilts and clothing, made using quilt making techniques. Show space is limited. Only the first 150 quilts/clothing received will be accepted.
- Members are limited to four quilted items, plus one member challenge.
- Non-guild members are limited to two quilt entries. There is an entry fee of \$20 per non-member for one OR two quilts. Make checks payable to ELIQG.
- One form must be filled out for each quilt being entered. You may copy the entry form if entering more than one quilt/clothing item.
- **Entry registration deadline: handed in at an ELIQG meeting/postmarked/sent NO LATER THAN: May 1, 2010**, by U.S. mail, hand-delivered, e-mail or fax: Lynn Fullshire, 32 Lower Cross, Shoreham, NY 11786, Fax# 631-852-1782 or email: lfullshi@courts.state.ny.us
- Unless otherwise notified the item being registered has been accepted into the show, pending hands-on inspection at quilt delivery. If you must withdraw the item notify the quilt registrar one week prior to the delivery date: Lynn Fullshire 631-744-7640.
- Please credit the traditional pattern or commercial pattern from which your quilt is made.
- Entries do not have to fit the show theme.
- Quilts/clothing must have been constructed by person(s) named on the entry form. Group quilts are made by 3 or more quilters (such as Round Robins). Name of group or all quilters involved must be submitted. Duet Quilts; top created by owner/maker, quilted by another and/or a professional. Name of the professional quilter must be submitted.
- Your signature signifies your agreement with these rules and gives permission for ELIQG to photograph your entry for local and regional use in media advertising, promotion, and publication in newspapers, magazines, internet and other appropriate media.

ENTRY RULES

- Quilts or clothing must not have been previously exhibited in an ELIQG Quilt Show.
- The guild reserves the right, for whatever reason, to accept or reject any submitted entry.
- Quilts **MUST** have a 4 inch wide cloth casing (sleeve) securely sewn to the top back for hanging. (If sleeve is missing or the opening is narrower than 4" the quilt will not be accepted).
- Quilts must have a label on the back with your name, address and telephone number.
- Exhibitors are responsible for their own insurance on their quilts/clothing while in our possession and quilts/clothing must remain on display for the entire show.
- Please check over your quilt and make sure it is free of loose threads, animal hair, etc. All quilts must arrive clean, undamaged, and free of strong odors in order to be judged and shown. ELIQG reserves the right to omit an entry from judging or display if the quality or condition does not meet standards upon hands-on inspection.
- ELIQG is not responsible for embellishments on your quilt. Make sure they are well secured.

JUDGING

- All quilts and clothing will be judged for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place ribbons within their category. (see Registration Form for more details).
- ELIQG reserves the right to reassign categories as necessary to ensure fair judging.
- A BEST IN SHOW ribbon(s) may be awarded by the judge. 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and Honorable Mention ribbons may be awarded by the judge in each category. Judge's Recognition ribbons may be awarded at the judge's discretion. Viewer's Choice ribbons will be awarded to the quilts/clothing receiving the most votes from the viewing public. A Judge's Choice ribbon may be awarded by the judge.
- Any ribbon within a category may not be awarded. It is the judge's decision whether or not to award all prizes within a category.
- All quilts and clothing will receive a written evaluation. Generally, quilters gain insight from receiving this feedback.

QUILT DELIVERY

Your quilts in compliance with entry rules will be accepted in person at Suffolk Community College, Riverhead, NY, **between 3 P.M. and 7 P.M. on Tuesday, June 1, 2010** in the large dining room in the Peconic Building. There you will receive your call number for hands-on inspection/turn-in, and your receipts. At this time all paperwork pertaining to your quilts will be reviewed by you, the registrar and show committee members. The receipt will serve to claim your quilt at the close of the show.

QUILT RETURN

All quilts must remain on display throughout the entire show. **When picking up your quilt, please report to the Main Lobby in the Peconic Building of Suffolk Community College, Riverhead, NY between 5 P.M. and 5:30 P.M., Sunday, June 6 to receive your call number.** No quilt/clothing item will be returned without a receipt. For the safety and protection of your quilt you must present your receipt before your quilt will be returned to you or your representative. A form of ID and signature will be required at pick up.
